## Notes

1. If your declaration covers donations you may make in the future:
  - please notify the parish if you change your name or address while the declaration is still in force
  - you can cancel the declaration at any time by notifying the parish – it will then not apply to donations you make on or after the date of cancellation or such later date as you specify.
2. You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the parish reclaims on your donations in the tax year (currently 28p for each £ you give)
3. If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that the parish reclaims, you can cancel your declaration (see note 1)
4. If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim extra tax relief in your Self Assessment return.
5. If you are unsure whether your donation qualifies for tax relief, please ask the parish. Or you can ask your local tax office for the booklet IR65 - Giving to Charities by Individuals.
